## **Apollo Video Technology Awarded Contract to increase Mobile Video Surveillance for the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority**

*Apollo systems added to supplement GCRTA existing systems*

Bothell, Wash. – June 11, 2013 – Apollo Video Technology ([www.apollovideo.com](http://www.apollovideo.com)) was selected by The Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (GCRTA) to provide and install cameras and Digital Video Recorders (DVRs) on part of the Authority's rolling stock video systems. Apollo Video Technology was awarded the contract after a formal, competitive, procurement process. The multi-phase project leverages existing equipment on a portion of the vehicles and provides new equipment and installations on vehicles not previously equipped with video surveillance.

Servicing 1.3 million people over approximately 458 square miles throughout 59 municipalities, GCRTA offers multiple modes of transportation, including bus, paratransit, trolleys, Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) called the HealthLine, and both heavy and light rail systems.

The project will outfit nearly 400 buses, trolleys and rail cars with the RoadRunner™ Mobile Video Recording System to capture and record video and audio from interior and exterior mounted cameras. The video surveillance system will help deter incidents on-board, and provide a valuable investigative tool if events occur in or around the transit vehicles.

A long-time customer of Apollo Video, GCRTA purchased new paratransit vehicles equipped with a previous version of the RoadRunner system in 2007.

Apollo Video is committed to long-term compatibility and interoperability, as the new components are compatible with prior systems.

"Product enhancements have been implemented since our initial installation with GCRTA, providing higher resolution video, larger storage capacity, and smarter software that provides backwards compatibility – allowing GCRTA to capitalize on its investment" said Rodell Notbohm, CEO and Founding Partner of Apollo Video Technology. "We look forward to continuing our partnership with GCRTA and working together to support a fleet-wide solution."

The \$2.3M contract consists of several phases and installation is expected to be complete in 2014.
